After the last few years - and all the problems that Square Dancing has faced with covid - it is really fantastic that the B.A.A.S.D.C. have taken the decision to run this event!

Both of us are really pleased to have been invited to take part - and we are looking forward to seeing the majority of the UK dancers together at one location, in order to celebrate such an important anniversary. We also applaud the B.A.A.S.D.C. for making such a clear statement to the world that Square Dancing is still going strong in the UK. Hopefully, this event will be the springboard of a great future for UK Square Dancing!

On an historical note, both of us were present at the 25th B.A.A.S.D.C. Birthday Dance, held at Picketts Lock, London in 1978. It was the first major Square Dance event that either of us had attended. We were a lot younger then and we travelled to the Dance with our parents, who were keen Square Dancers. The event completely "sold-out", in advance (1500 tickets were available); "25 Year Badges" were given to all that attended. The Calling was carried out by B.A.A.S.D.C. and S.D.C.C.G.B. founder Tommy Cavanagh.

It was at this point that we both started Calling; all of our success in this role is due to the support of the Dancers - thank you for that. It is wonderful to still be a part of the UK Square Dance activity and we are extremely honoured to have been Calling so long!

To finish the story: The 30th Birthday Dance - with Dave Clay Calling - was held at the Harrow Leisure Centre, the 40th (back to Picketts Lock again) with 5 Callers representing the North, the South, the East, the West and the London area of the country. Both the 50th and 60th provided Halls for a whole range of different Dance Programmes and used a large number of Callers (50 for the 50th)! Here is what you can expect at the 70th:

On Friday night Kevin Lovell (President of SDCCGB) and Di Green are Calling MS/PLUS; with Judy Read on Rounds. Musings from your Public Relations Officer April 2023

Home Thoughts from Abroad by Robert Browning is a lovely poem beginning with the famous line 'Oh, to be in England now that April's there'. Fine words and I concur; you only have to look around to see all the signs of Spring. Enjoy them!

I'm sure many of you, like me are all too aware that Square and Round dancing activities are in decline. Before Covid struck we had 120 Square and Round dance clubs, now that number has dropped to just over 80. Not only have we lost Clubs but with that inevitably comes a loss of dancers and Callers and Cuers.

The 64,000 dollar question was the name of a U.S. quiz show in the 1950's. If you were able to answer the last question in the quiz correctly you would win that sum of money. It has become an idiom for the most important question.

So the 64,000 dollar question is, how can we prolong the life of dancing?

Many years ago I became involved in a research project being carried out by Professor Pallo Flori of Oxford University. Originally from Sicily in Italy, he and his team are looking into the possibility of slowing down or reversing the aging process. He believes in time that human ageing may be able to be delayed or even reversed.

He has recently contacted me with a view to setting up a working party with some of our dancers Callers and Cuers taking part in trialling different techniques that may slow down our aging process and consequently prolong the life of our beloved activity.

Sunshine Revival ~ *Corben Geis, Tony Oxendine* Silver Sounds SSR 425 (*Original Artist: Henry Kapono*)

Henry Kapono - one half of an Hawaiian Pop Music duo: "Cecilio & Kapono" (formed in 1973) - recorded, wrote and released this track in 2020; which features on his album: "Henry's House" and tells of the fun that you can have at the weekend, when you meet up with friends and socialise! The Square Dance version has a full instrumental, in the style of the original, featuring a first-rate vocal from Corben Geis and Tony Oxendine!

Mainstream Figure: Heads Square Thru Four Hands, Right Hand Star Heads Star Left, Touch a Quarter, Scoot Back, Scoot Back, Swing.

A Place in the Sun ~ Aki Nakajima

Rhythm School RS 733 (Original Artist: Stevie Wonder)

A 1966 soul single by American and Motown musician Stevie Wonder - this song was his third Top Ten hit since 1963 and was written by Ronald Miller and Bryan Wells; it was one of Stevie's first songs to contain "social commentary": speaking about the need to find a "Place in the Sun... ...like a branch on a tree, I keep reaching to be free...". The musical arrangement and quality is excellent; the track includes an outstanding vocal!

Mainstream Figure: Heads Square Thru Four Hands, Right Hand Star Heads Star Left, Do Sa Do, Swing Thru, Boys Trade, Swing and Promenade.

Good Old Country Song ~ *Mike Seastrom & Vic / Shauna Kaaria*Chic CHIC 1084 / 2084 (Original Artist: Lynn Anderson)

From the 1975 album: "I've Never Loved Anyone More"; written by Glenn Sutton, who was Lynn Anderson's husband and her producer at the time, produced the album. The song title tells you what the lyrics are all about; the tag line is: "I can groove on Rock & Roll, Rhythm & Blues and I kinda like Soul - but play me a good old country song". Chic have created some first class music and present both a Male and Female version!

Mainstream: Heads Promenade Half, Square Thru Four, Right and Left Thru Veer Left, Ferris Wheel, Touch a Quarter, Box Circulate Twice, Swing.

Made In Japan ∼ Tom Miller

ESP ESP 366 (Original Artist: Buck Owens)

A 1972 single by Buck Owens; it was his last number one on the country chart as a solo artist. The single spent thirteen weeks on the chart - holding the number one spot for one week. It was written by Bob Morris and Faye Morris and appeared on Buck Owens' album: "The Palm of Your Hand". ESP offer a faithful version of the music, which has a steady walking beat - and great instrumentation - with a terrific vocal from Tom Miller!

Mainstream Choreography: Heads Promenade Halfway, Square Thru Four Right and Left Thru, Veer Left, Ferris Wheel, Square Thru Three, Swing.

Travelling Shoes ~ Steve Edlund

Riverboat RIV 1264 (Original Artist: Joan Baez)

From the 1959 album: "Folksingers 'Round Harvard Square", with lyrics by Joan Baez, Bill Wood and Ted Alevizos; this song is about the pathway through life - as explained by a mother; the tag-line of the chorus is: "all God's children need travelin' shoes". As usual Riverboat have produced some first class top quality music - that is in the style of the original, featuring the vocal talents of Canadian Caller Steve Edlund - a great vocal!

Mainstream Choreography: Heads Promenade Halfway, Square Thru Four Right and Left Thru, Veer Left, Ferris Wheel, Square Thru Three, Swing.

This Land Is Your Land ~ Don Coy

Coyote COY 861 (Original Artist: Woodie Guthrie)

One of the United States' most famous folk songs, it's lyrics were written by American folk singer Woody Guthrie in 1940, as a response to Irving Berlin's "God Bless America"; in 2002 it was added to the National Recording Registry - by the Library of Congress. A well constructed instrumental from Coyote, featuring a "pounding" beat that is easy to follow; Don Coy (owner and producer of Coyote Records) does a great job on the Vocal!

Mainstream Figure: Heads Square Thru Four Hands, Right Hand Star Heads Star Left, Right and Left Thru, Rollaway, Pass Thru, U Turn Back.



Caller's Corner UK CALLER By PAUL BRISTOW (CALLERLAB Accredited Caller Coach) CALLERLAB Accredited Caller Coach)

Callers Corner - Memory, a Method but how much does a caller need to use?

"Memory" is one of the five methods used to create Choreography, it was included to represent the fact that - in the early days of Modern Western Square Dancing (40s/50s) - the dances were "wrote" (i.e. "set-in-stone"), there were no Patter tips, consequently, they could be memorised. Up until the end of the 1970s, a lot of Choreography was still suitable for memorising; it was usual for every Singing Call to have its own figure, which would be followed, without variation, whenever that Singing Call was used (if you tried to Call anything else, the Dancers would probably ignore what you were Calling)! The option of using the same choreography - on each of the figure parts - still exists today.

If you go back far enough there was a time when there was no Patter section of a tip - and you could work entirely from your memory; it was the Caller's ability to present the memorised information that determined your success as a Caller. In the mid 1970s, when I started Dancing, it was quite usual to have a lot of Singing Call tips during the course of a dance; sometimes only a couple of tips had a Patter - almost as a gimmick - and Singing Calls would all be presented with the figure, as Called by the Caller on the other side of the record. Nowadays, a greater use of memory is required - as Patter is included, on almost every tip and Singing Calls quite often have four different figures.

There are other aspects of memory which are essential to the Caller; first to learn which Calls are on which list, second you have to learn the definitions of each of the Calls and all the ways that they can (or cannot) be strung together, without any major problems. Third you should memorise some short modules that achieve important changes within the square, e.g. "Magic Module", also the "Chicken Plucker" and the "Invert and Rotate" Modules. Fourth you need to remember who was dancing with whom; you also need to remember the Sequence of the dancers, their home starting position - as well as quite a lot of systematic aspects as are required by the various Choreographic control Systems.


Any Caller that relies heavily upon Module choreography - will do well to remember as many as possible of the modules that they have created. This achieves two things; first it allows the Caller to track the Dancers - while providing instruction - second it prevents the Caller from reading choreography and suddenly discovering that no one is dancing!

Any Caller who relies upon Sight Calling needs to remember all of the information about each Call and how to track the Dancers and take them to where they need to be, by the shortest possible (or most enjoyable) route; this depends upon memorised information and includes knowing which of the four different sequence conditions exist at any time.

Callers using Mental Image systems need to remember which Calls are on the X list and which are on the O list; they also need an understanding of the two sub-conditions into which the four sequence situations are split i.e. All In & All Out - or - Boys In/Girls Out & Boys Out/Girls In (the basis of the X and O ideology). They need to be able to track the key dancer - and remember which aspects of the choreography that they are using will cause the Allemande position to "move" between the "Four Allemande" locations...

So - as you can see - "Memory" is of paramount importance to a successful Caller!

Dancing Without A Caller

Everyone within Square Dance is aware of the declining number of clubs, dancers and callers, with much speculation as to which is the primary cause. Is it a shortage of callers that results in fewer dancers, or a shortage of dancers which means fewer callers? After all, the majority of callers were once dancers, and people can't become dancers without a caller... or can they?

For many years there has been debate about what has been referred to 'tape clubs' – clubs which do not have a caller and use recorded material instead. There is a vast amount of such recorded material out there. Virtually every Square Dance music producer offers a 'called' version of each song (singing call), which can be played in your homes, AND in public so long as you have purchased a copy of the song. Similarly, the producers supply a called version for many of the patters too, again, most all of which may be used – so long as you have bought the MP3 (or have got the physical vinyl).

Any club which sufficient dancer numbers can therefore continue dancing when a caller retires even if another caller is not available. They just need someone who is willing to organise the venue/hall, acquire and operate the sound equipment, purchase a reasonable selection of music, and run the dance sessions.

As has been highlighted previously, many clubs operate this way globally, and have a lot of fun doing so. Those run correctly are applauded and encouraged by both Callers Club and BAASDC. In fact, a few years ago, through the FFT, Callers Club were offering workshops and training to anyone wishing to organise such a club, leading dancers using recorded materials, hoping such clubs could develop and prosper. Unfortunately, not a single person inquired about this course and what we could offer by way of assistance. If you are interested please contact Callers Club as we are very happy to offer assistance where we can.

Sadly, some of these clubs have been known to use shall we say 'less official' recordings. They have 'gotten their hands' on copies of songs, they have recorded workshops, events and dances, etc., etc.. The use of these recordings in the UK is not recommended and cannot be endorsed by Callers Club as it breaks UK copyright laws and anyone using them could face prosecution, as could the person who made the

recording. I know, I know, you have heard this before and many of you will say "no one will care", "no one will ever find out", etc. and you may be right. But as leaders for our activity, we cannot encourage nor participate in such actions. It is our duty to set an example for correct behaviour and to point out this is not legal – what you do with that information is ultimately up to you.

The wide use of recorded material has raised the prospect of not only providing dancing for experienced dancers but also offering teaching for new dancers. This is a great idea and one fully supported by Callers Club and BAASDC..... so long as it can be done in a legal way.

The article David Eagland referred to in his message in the March issue of LSD outlines a valid approach anyone could follow. The CallerLab article he talked of, provides a list of material which is already available and can be acquired to teach complete beginners. I have no idea which licenses, etc. the producers and distributors have acquired and one can only assume their use would be legal in the UK, though we cannot confirm this.

Significant effort has been spent over recent years by Callers Club investigating how we could legally produce these so-called Teaching Tapes. We recognise it would be a benefit and make sense for us to do so. We have, to the best of our knowledge, never said it was BAASDC's job as suggested by some. However, we will only do so in a way that is fully legal and risk free to ourselves and the end users.

The first thing to recognise is whenever you record a vocal over some music you are creating a 'new version' of the song. To do so you need the permission of the original writers and producer. I am happy to report that we have organised the permission of several Square Dance producers who will allow us to use their music for this purpose. However, it is not that straight forward. They do not always have rights to the underlying music (and such rights are not transferable), and even if they did, in the UK we would still need to have a Mechanical License to reproduce it.

One project, sadly interrupted by Covid, was looking at recording the vocal instructions separately from the music to overcome some of these restrictions. Doing so raises other concerns regarding synchronising

when playing back – it would need two tracks to be played simultaneously. Any attempt to record the combination beforehand would again be a new version and not legal.

As recognised by some of the previous discussions, the resultant materials could have many deficiencies. If, as has regularly been suggested, we simply record someone's lessons it really won't work. Most callers don't only use verbal teaching (the only method available on a true teaching tape) as they also use a combination of demonstrations, illustrations, even physically showing dancers how to do something. The recordings would also need significant editing to remove any 'personalised comments', the sort of additional teaching which varies from class to class. There would also be technical challenges to ensure the recordings were clear – recording produced in a studio are significantly clearer than those recorded live. One may also find, some students will not give permission for you to film them either.

To make any effort worthwhile and overcome such issues, ensuring the resulting teaching tapes are effective, a script would need to be developed and used.

Obviously, some callers have overcome these issues (or accepted the problems) and arranged the necessary licenses and permissions (or possibly overlooked the legalities), and made teaching materials available. I suggest anyone looking for teaching materials investigate what is available and choose something that suits their needs. It is not that we don't want to produce some ourselves; it is not that we don't care; it is just not as easy as many believe.
