PS - I'd like to add that when all else fails, you could call "customer service" in some foreign country and be instructed in some foreign language how to fix your car yourself!



#### Sweet Child of Mine ~ Travis Cook

Royal RYL 1034 (Original Artists: Guns 'N' Roses)

This was the first single from Guns 'N' Roses, released in 1987 and taken from their first album: "Appetite for Destruction"; it was created in a jam session when Slash - the lead Guitarist - was warming up, the rest of the group joined in and - as Slash said - "within an hour my guitar exercise had become something else". Royal have done a superb job on the instrumentation, the music is great and the vocal is well performed by Travis!

**Mainstream Figure:** Square Thru Four, Slide Thru, Reverse Flutterwheel Dixie Style to an Ocean Wave, Girls Circulate, Allemande Left, Swing.

### Free Fallin' ~ Philipp Kamm

Arrowhead ARROW 1166 (Original Artist: Tom Petty)

The opening track from American musician Tom Petty's 1989 - debut solo album -: "Full Moon Fever"; the song written by Tom and his writing partner for the album, Jeff Lynne - features Lynne on backing vocals and bass guitar. The song achieved No.1 on the US Mainstream Rock Billboard Chart - and No.7 on the Hot 100 chart Singles. Arrowhead provide terrific music in their version, with a first class vocal, delivered by Philipp Kamm!

**Mainstream Choreography:** Square Thru Four, Swing Thru, Spin the Top Right and Left Thru, Square Thru Three, Swing and Promenade.

#### Candida ~ Darin Keith

Fine Tune FT 233 (Original Artists: Tony Orlando & Dawn)

The title track from the 1970 album by studio session group: "Dawn", which comprised Tony Orlando, Toni Wine and Linda November; the single, written by Irvine Levine and Toni Wine, achieved the number one spot on the US Billboard Chart. Tony Orlando put together a real touring group by the name of: "Tony Orlando & Dawn". Fine Tune have done an outstanding job with both the music - with a first-class vocal from Darin Keith!

**Mainstream Choreography:** Square Thru Four, Swing Thru, Spin the Top Right and Left Thru, Square Thru Three, Swing and Promenade.

### Years May Come, Years May Go ~ Jeff Garbutt

Knee-Deep KDM 174 (Original Artist: Herman's Hermits)

A song written by André Popp and Jack Fishman and performed by Herman's Hermits, it reached No. 7 on the UK Singles Chart and No. 31 on the Kent Music Report in 1970; it is interesting to note that this song was produced by Mickie Most. The tune has a very catchy musical melody and offers the chance for Dancers to sing "replies". Knee Deep's Pop-Style music works really well and is supported by a terrific vocal from Jeff Garbutt!

**Mainstream Choreography:** Heads Square Thru Four, Right Hand Star Heads Star Left, Right and Left Thru, Half Sashay, Swing and Promenade.

#### Bad Habits ~ Christian Sorge

SharpShooter SS 1086 (Original Artist: Ed Sheeran)

The lead single from Ed Sheeran's fourth studio album: = ("Equals"), it was released in 2021 and was a commercial success, spending eleven weeks in the No.1 spot in the UK and Ireland; it was also a No.1 hit in 28 other countries including: Australia, Belgium, Canada, Germany, Hungary, New Zealand, Switzerland and South Africa! Sharpshooter really excel at modern tunes with some excellent music, Christian shines on the Vocal!

**Mainstream Choreography:** Square Thru Four, Swing Thru, Spin the Top Right and Left Thru, Half Sashay, Touch a Quarter, Boys Run, Swing.

### Somewhere in Texas ~ Doug Davis

Chinook CK 273 (Original Artist: Ray Price)

From the 1982 album: "Somewhere in Texas", the song is listed as: "Somewhere Down in Texas" and was released as a single by that name; it was written by Ray Pennington and was one of the many tunes recorded by Ray Price, who was regarded as one of the best Baritone voices in country music and a great advocate of using 4/4 (the "Ray Price beat"). Really smooth well played music, together with an outstandingly good vocal!


The raffle, organised by Diane, raised £300.00 for The Heart Foundation, and we would like to thank everyone who contributed to that.

### **London Visitors and the ULEZ Scheme**

This year, Hogsmill SDC has welcomed several visitors from Germany, Australia and Sweden because we are easily accessible from Waterloo or Vauxhall Stations. Our normal Mainstream venue is right next to Stoneleigh Station and our Plus venue is a five-minute walk from Chessington North. Public transport is very reliable here and many of our members travel to club nights by bus or train. We also have direct trains from Guildford to Stoneleigh.

Recently, I have been asked if visitors with cars will have a problem under The Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) scheme.

ULEZ has been operating since August 2023 and most people are not affected because most cars are ULEZ compliant.

ULEZ operates 24 hours a day, midnight to midnight, every day of the year, except Christmas Day (25 December).

You can check if your vehicle is acceptable as ULEZ compliant on the tfl website: <a href="https://tfl.gov.uk/modes/driving/check-your-vehicle/">https://tfl.gov.uk/modes/driving/check-your-vehicle/</a>

There are also ULEZ maps showing you which roads to avoid if your car is not compliant.

The following halls are outside the ULEZ zone:-

- $1. \text{All Saints Church, West Ewell where Terry Chapman is calling on } 13^{\text{th}} \text{ April 2024}$
- $2.4^{\text{th}}$  Worcester Park Scout Hut where we dance A on Sundays once a month.
- 3.St John's Church, Stoneleigh where we dance Mainstream on a Tuesday evening.

However, some of the roads nearby are included in the ULEZ zone so if you have a non-compliant car, it might be wise to check your route.

Halls we use that are within the ULEZ zone include:-

Chessington Methodist Church where we dance Plus on a Monday evening

Shiraz Mirza Community Hall, Manor Park where the Early Birds dance SSD on a Tuesday morning.

This sounds complicated, partly because we are on the outer edge of London. It does affect very few of our dancers, but I thought I should warn people who might not be aware of the scheme.

# Caller's Corner UK CALLER By PAUL BRISTOW (CALLERLAB According Colleg Conch) According Colleg Conch)

### Callers Corner - The History of the Square Dance Caller's Club of Great Britain.

In 1954, one year after the BAASDC was started, Caller's Club was founded by the same people: Mildred Buhler, Pete Morris and Tommy Cavanagh. The BAASDC meetings had been very successful - but as the majority of Club leaders were Callers - it became clear that a Caller meeting should be a separate event held on the same day; for the first 45 years, the meetings would share a venue but the "Dancer" meetings would occur in the early afternoon - with Caller meetings taking place before and after; this was extremely beneficial as many of those that attended travelled from all over the UK, to the London area; combined meetings meant that they only had to make the trip once. It was soon decided to hold Caller meetings on the second Sunday of the second month (starting in January); the BAASDC meetings would take place on 4 of those occasions, one of which would be the BAASDC AGM; Sundays was a "No Brainer" for the meetings as the Callers and Dancers were far too busy on Saturdays! I have no personal knowledge of the first 20 years, my comments above are based upon research and what people have told me

I started to attend the BAASDC meetings in 1975 and very soon joined Caller's Club, so that I could take part in everything on the day. Pete Skiffins had just taken over as the Training Director and set up an extremely efficient New Caller Training opportunity, for those at the meetings; I was quick to join in with these sessions and learnt alongside so many Callers, some of whom went on to be extremely successful. Caller training took place early in the morning and was eventually extended to occur (in parallel to the main meetings) for the major part of the day; by the time that happened, I had become a member of the council and the priority for me was to be in the regular meeting - but I never lost touch with the Caller Training and - to this day - owe my eventual success as a CALLERLAB Accredited Caller Coach to Pete Skiffins, partly due to Pete taking a short two-year break from Caller Training in 1986. Pete returned in 1988 and very soon was elected as the President (as well as the Training Director). Whereupon he coordinated the first CALLERLAB Mini-lab (an official meeting held outside of the United States).

At some point close to the turn of the century, the BAASDC decided it needed to move it's meetings around the country, thus Callers Club became responsible for the full cost of the venue where the joint Bi-Monthly meetings had been held. This continued for a short period but eventually it was decided to cease regular Callers Club meetings (with the exception of the AGM) - but hold occasional meetings in tandem with the RCAs.

When Callers Club first began, it was named as the "Square Dance Callers Club of Great Britain"; this was changed to "Callers Club" in the early 1960s, when badges were first created and reverted back to SDCCGB at the suggestion of Malcolm Davis in 1988.

I am very proud to have been a very active member of Callers Club responsible for a large number of initiatives, for 48 years and - despite what you may have heard - I am still a Full Accredited Member. A little over five years ago, I was barred from attending meetings of SDCCGB and associated bodies (RCAs and GSI); I am, obviously, extremely upset by this situation. I have been recently told - by an SDCCGB Council member that the entire membership "unanimously" voted to deny me access to future meetings; at first for a two year period and have now decided subsequently to make that permanent!

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
