

# Musings from your Public Relations Officer "Spring is in the air"

A letter has been received by the British Association of American Square Dance Clubs lamenting the demise of the 'biscuit' from the refreshment table at Square and Round dance events.

This has, of course, raised alarm bells at H.Q. as not only is the social, mental and spiritual welfare of our dancers of concern, but also their physical health and this is not helped when their sugar levels could plummet at a time of increased high levels of vigorous physical exertion.



#### Magic Moments ~ Mike Seastrom

Rhythm Records RR 449 (Original Artists: Perry Como)

One of the first songwriting collaborations by Burt Bacharach (composer) and Hal David (writer), this song was recorded by Perry Como and released in 1957; it was the B-side of his "Catch a Falling Star" and reached No. 1 in the UK in 1958. Rhythm have done a superb job on the instrumentation, beautifully capturing the feel of the original music in a clever arrangement of the parts of the song; Mike Seastrom's wonderful vocal is great! Promenade Halfway, Pass the Ocean, Extend, Swing Thru, Spin the Top Right and Left Thru, Square Thru - on the third hand - Slide Thru, Swing.

## **Love, Love me Honey Do ~ Joe Saltel / Patty Greene**Chic CHIC 1093 / 2093 (Original Artist: Patsy Cline)

This song was originally released as a single on Decca in 1959 (B-Side to "True Love" by Cole Porter) but did not get an album release until 1964, when it appeared as a track on the compilation album: "Thats how a Heartache Begins". It was written by C. C Beam, C. L. Jiles and W. S. Stevenson. Chic do a great job on their version of this, providing their usual top-quality music, together with your choice of vocals, from Patty and Joe!

**Mainstream Choreography:** Heads Promenade Halfway, Square Thru Four Swing Thru, Swing Thru, Balance, All Eight Circulate, Swing and Promenade.

## 25 or 6 to 4 ~ Rick Hampton

Fine Tune FT 234 (Original Artists: Chicago)

A song written by American musician Robert Lamm, (one of the founding members of the band Chicago) that was recorded in 1969 for the band's second album: "Chicago", with Peter Cetera on lead vocals. The song's title is the time at which the song is set: 25 or 26 minutes before 4 a.m and is about composing music in the middle of the night! Fine Tune have done an outstanding job with both the music - and a first-class vocal!

**Mainstream Choreography:** Heads Promenade Halfway, Pass the Ocean Extend, All Eight Circulate - two times, Swing Thru, Boys Trade, Swing.

## Lava Song ~ Di Ashton

Knee-Deep KDM 175 (Original Artists: Kuana Torres Kahele and Nāpua Greig)

Written by James Ford Murphy and featured in the 2014 Pixar Film: "Lava". This is a song, telling the story of a volcano that sings to the ocean each day for millions of years - but does not realize that a female submarine volcano (having heard him every day) has fallen in love with him. Knee Deep use Hawaiian-Style Ukulele music, as played in the original song, arranged so that the whole story can be told by Di Ashton's Vocal!

**Mainstream:** Promenade Halfway, Square Thru Four, Right and Left Thru Veer Left, Couples Circulate, Chain Down the Line, Square Thru Three, Swing.

#### Take me Away ∼ *Jerry Junck*

ESP ESP 808 (Original Artist: George Strait)

Written by George Strait, his son Bubba Strait and also Dean Dillon, this is a track from the 2019 album: "Honky Tonk Time Machine" - that hit No.4 on the US Billboard 200 on it's release (with 51,000 album-equivalent units, including 44,000 pure album sales) and peaked at No.1 on the Billboard US Top Country Album Chart. An excellent version, with brilliant music - and a great beat structure from ESP; Jerry Junck excels on the Vocal!

**Mainstream:** Promenade Half, Square Thru Four, Swing Thru, Boys Trade Boys Run, Bend the Line, Star Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By, Swing.

#### Bread and Butter ~ Dean Black

Riverboat RIV 1359 (Original Artists: Newbeats)

The title track from the debut album by "The Newbeats", originally released in 1964, the single reached No.2 on the Billboard Hot 100 chart and the album reached No.56 on the Billboard 200; in the UK, the single achieved No.15 (8<sup>th</sup> - 14<sup>th</sup> October 1964 - when No.1 was held by Pretty Woman). Recorded with the same "pounding beat" as was used on the original, this is well played music, with an outstandingly good vocal from Dean!

**Plus Figure:** Square Thru Four, Right and Left Thru, Veer Left, Ferris Wheel Centres Veer Left, Veer Right, Single Circle, Star Thru - and Promenade.

# Caller's Corner UK CALLER BY PAUL BRISTOW (CALLERLAB ACCOMPTED CAMER CAPER) OF PAUL BRISTOW (CALLERLAB ACCOMPTED CAPER)

#### Callers Corner – UK Caller Training Foundation, report on first two meetings.

The UK Caller Training Foundation (UKCTF) have (so far) held two extremely successful Caller Seminars, which have given me the chance to carry out presentations allowing a group of Callers (some of whom are fairly new, whilst some are extremely experienced) to begin revisiting all aspects of being a Square Dance Caller. We are using a new type of teaching paradigm, requiring a high level of feedback and interaction from all those in attendance, which - I am very pleased to be able to report - has been extremely well received. I am taking this approach to provide the most detailed transfer of information possible, rather than simply saying what is written, I explain why it does what it does, the history behind each principle and the ways upon which it can be built to ensure that every Caller has the information necessary to create a personal development plan - that will suit them as an individual; our primary goal being to promote personal Calling skills.


Obviously, to really experience how this works, you'd have to be there - and - as things stand at present, you are very welcome to join us - we can quite easily accommodate a few more... However, with an average attendance of fifteen Callers (which is extremely nice to see) we are not that far from the limit of the venue, in terms of space available.

Some of the items that we have so far discussed include:

- 1) The only two Formations from where Allemande Left can be Called.
- 2) The Four Allemandes (and why there are five of them).
- 3) Using the above two ideas to find an Allemande in three (or fewer) Calls from any choreographic situation (FASR).
- 4) The ideas behind and the value of understanding and utilising Technical Zeros, so you stop worrying about "who was dancing with whom".
- 5) How to resolve the Square by only following one dancer using Xs & Os
- 6) The utilisation of the "Invert and Rotate" module to greatly improve the variety in Modular Choreography (I was very surprised to discover that this essential element of Choreographic Control seemed to be virtually unknown to all of those present)!

Also enjoying great success are the dances that we put on after the seminar at which - any Caller who attended the seminar has the chance to Call to a group of dancers and by so doing "practice" their skills. The dancers who attend the early evening sessions are representative of a good cross section of dancing skills - and ability - thus providing a real world experience for the Callers. We dance Mainstream, so anybody who wishes to attend can do so; we are meeting on the third, Sunday of each second month.

Our next Seminar and Dance will be held on 19th May (from 2.30 to 5.30) and we will dance from 7.00 till 9.30, in the evening, following the Seminar; any dancer, who would like to join us, to help these Callers to practice in a "real world" situation, are extremely welcome, (full details of these events are listed on the BAASDC website).
